Zonta House has been awarded a Lotterywest grant of \$385,952 towards the cost of



renovations and Information Technology at our new Head Office located in Willetton. The purchase of the building was made possible by a generous donation from Lois Goodram and is set to officially open in March 2018.

Hon. Simone McGurk MLA attended the premises to present Glenda Scott Chairperson and Kelda Oppermann CEO with our Lotterywest Grant Certificate.

Head Office Renovations

The 3rd October 2017 was a very significant day at Zonta House, as we officially started our Head Office renovations.

The first tradesmen on site were two electricians who started work on the new data cable installations for our IT equipment implementation, undertaken by IT Management Associates.

The renovations are being undertaken by Modus Property based in Cannington who earlier this year completed a corporate volunteering day and repainted the main areas of the Crisis Centre all in a day.

Modus moved in on the 16th October and started the demolition and what a difference a few days makes, the site was a hive of activity and the work is progressing well.

During the renovations Head Office staff will be moving to AMCAP who are based in Welshpool, with service delivery staff and project officers

working from the Crisis Centre. We are hoping to be all moved back in to the refurbished office by the end of 2017.

2017 Perth Chevron City to Surf

This year's Perth City to Surf was held on the 27th August and Zonta House had a great presence with a total of 34 team members across the 4km walk and 12km run.

New blue t-shirts were also debuted and we stood out in the crowd with our posters to raise awareness and support for Family and Domestic Violence.

It was a lovely warm day and the team was in great spirits.



The team marched over the finish line in little over 1 hour which was a great effort by all. The talk on the walk was to conquer the 12km walk in 2018!

A huge thank you to all of the team and their individual supporters for their amazing efforts - a grand total of \$5,740 was raised towards our unfunded projects.

Zonta House Linen Fundraiser 1st – 24th October 2017

Ella and Rachael from the office attended a free Crowdfunding workshop facilitated by Chuffed.org as part of this year's Social Impact Festival, and learnt how to raise money through their platform which gives 100% of the donations to the organisation.

Zonta House ran a "Linen Fundraiser" from 1st to 24th October in the hope of raising \$3,000 to fully refit the Crisis Centre with new linen – our biggest high turnover item.

The campaign was hugely successful with an amazing video produced by Xin Yi, Marketing Intern at the McCusker Centre for Citizenship UWA, we smashed the target with a grand total of \$3,605.00.

The campaign was shared 181 times and received 30 individual donations. The widespread reach of the campaign not only saw us reach and exceed our target but it also helped raise awareness for family and domestic violence and the work we do as an organisation within the WA community.

The \$605.00 over our target will be used to purchase the most in need linen items in our accommodation services.




Kind Words

Positive Pathways Update

Positive Pathways

"I am now at a point that I am not only surviving but learning and becoming aware of what it is I have been through" – Positive Pathways Participant

Positive Pathways provides a wonderful holistic integrative approach that gives the women that attend a sense of community, purpose and hope. Participating in PP courses helps women feel valued and connected, lessening their feelings of isolation and loneliness.

Our second Semester at Positive Pathways has been wonderful, we have had very good retention rates for women attending and some of the women have completely altered the direction in their lives as a direct result of



attending our courses, which is truly moving to witness. One of our regular participants told us that she has enrolled in TAFE for next year and another has learnt to set healthy boundaries with her

extended family which has been an ongoing issue for a very long time. We had new facilitators come on board this Semester, *Lisa Longman from "The Young Boxing Woman Project"*, Lisa facilitated 90 minute sessions with our participants each week as part of our Keeping Safe program. The women loved the boxing component, one participant commented that she didn't realise she had any fight left inside her and the boxing had brought that out. We also had a fitness Instructor *Karen Smith*

| NHALE COURAGE EXHALE FEAR who facilitated a session as part of the Women's Wellness series, the participants each went home with a Yoga Mat and a range of exercises they could do on their own without venturing to a gym.

We have had our regular presenters continue to support our program this Semester. We cooked up a storm with Glenda from Red Cross and the women all took home an abundance of food and healthy recipes that they were confident to cook on their own. The wonderful Di Wilcox from Make a Difference WA presented 2 Magic Coat courses and 3 Parenting Workshops these were all a roaring success and we received fantastic feedback from both the children and mothers who attended. We had visits from Alison from the Women's Law centre, Calvin and Christie from the Victim Support Unit and Sharyn and Zoe from Safer Pathways, they were all a part of our very popular Keeping Safe Program.


