Premier Mark McGowan \$60mil FDV Announcement



Zonta House was pleased to welcome Premier Mark McGowan, Minister Simon McGurk MLA, Minister Sue Ellery MLC, Dr Jags Labor Candidate for Riverton and Hon Kate Doust MLC at our Head Office on 10th February 2021 to announce the Labor Governments \$60mil Family and Domestic Violence election commitment as well as make the daily COVID cases announcement.

The Premier took the time to thank the team, many of which were staff from our two 24/7 Refuges, for

their work as a Frontline Service Workers and for the support given to women and their families during the pandemic.

Zonta House congratulates the Labor Government at recognizing the need for a multidimensional approach to addressing Family and Domestic Violence and the vast impact it has on individuals, families and the community. We acknowledge everyone in the community who has prioritized FDV as an urgent issue and most of all acknowledge the experiences and voices of victims/survivors and their families.

This commitment would provide an increase in safety and support for victims/survivors, bring change to systems that can cause harm, create more behaviour change opportunities for perpetrators and educate the community.

It is important to remember as individuals, organisations and the community that we all have a responsibility to contribute to ending Family and Domestic Violence.

Women's March4Justice

An incredible 3,000 people turned out to March in Perth CBD in the first of the country wide Women's March4Justice. Zonta House watched and marched along with many of our colleagues, friends and supporters in support.

The protesters demanded action against gendered violence and sexual assault. Rally organisers want the McGowan government



to introduce laws against coercive control, a strategic form of ongoing oppression and terrorism used to instill fear. The abuser will use tactics, such as limiting access to money or monitoring all communication, as a controlling effort.

"Today and everyday we advocate, support and go to battle with the women and families we are here for. We get tired but we get back up again and again and again because that is what is right and that is what is just. But we need help – we need to change the story. So we will try and contribute to the greater discussion that needs to be had and support the voices that need to be heard. For healing, for safety and for equality.

We stand in solidarity demanding change to the systems, policies and power that continually enables violence, abuse, assault and harassment of women in workplaces, homes and in the community. I don't want to wait twenty years – we need change now and we need leadership in our country to make this a priority and to take immediate action" - Kelda Oppermann CEO

to chat knit and create over a cup of tea each month.


